## INSTRUCTIONS

- Column 1 - Use one line, straight across the sheet, for each leave year. (The leave year is the same as the fiscal year: July 1 to June 30). Make all entries for each leave year in the spaces indicated; if 2 or more leaves were taken during any one LY, make separate items therefor in columns 4, 5, and 6.
- Column 2 - One month leave credit accrues at the beginning of each LY and should be entered in column 2 on July 1 (Dig Ops JAG 1912-30, sec 1786). For an officer entering on extended active duty at a date other than July 1, the leave credit is prorated on the basis of 2.5 days per month for the remainder of the LY. Thus, an officer RAD on November 1 would be credited with  $8 \times 2.5$ , or 20 days.
- Column 3 - The entry in this column is the sum of the entry in column 5 (for the preceding LY) plus that in column 2 (for the current LY). Note that this credit never can exceed 4 months (par 3b(2), AR 605-115, 17 June 1944.)
- Column 4 - The entry in this column is for the leave as actually taken, and should be supported by the entry in column 6. If the leave orders should grant 10 days, but you use only 9 days, then the numeral "9" should be entered in column 4 under "da". (See Note 3, below).
- Column 5 - The entry in this column is the difference between the figures in columns 3 and 4, and is carried forward to column 3 for the next LY (see comment opposite "Column 3," above). The entry in column 5 should be made on June 30.
- Column 6 - Entries in this column should support or explain the entries made in column 4; and, although brevity is desired, all essential data should be included, particularly the paragraph number, orders number, source, and the date.

### NOTES--

1. For leave credits accruing to officers whose status may change from that of Reserve to Regular Army, see par 3b(3), AR 605-115. In the case of a retired officer of the Regular Army recalled to active duty, see par 3b(5), AR 605-115.
2. Leaves of absence for vacation purposes, during the present war, are limited to 15 days each year (par 1, AAF Regulation 35-31, 5 April 1944); but this limitation does not apply to leaves granted in cases of emergency.
